

Chairman's Report

May I just say that as Chairman I urge all members to keep up to date with the Governments information regarding Coronavirus. Advice is likely to change as things go on so keep abreast of details via the various forms of media and remember that older people are the one's most at risk.

Because of the virus the Erdington Office has been closed although e-mails are being dealt with remotely. Many Borough and Branch meetings have been postponed and the Branch and National AGM's have been cancelled. The situation will be monitored and information put on the website as and when we know it.

Subscription Increase.

The National Council at their October 2019 meeting agreed to raise the national subscription for NARF to £12 from its current £9. This will take effect from 1st January 2021. Although this increase appears to be above inflation it will be the first increase in National Subscriptions for approximately 15 years. Over that time the association's costs have increased and the publication and postage of the NARF News has increased. Postage went up again on 23rd March 2020. The West Midlands Committee hope members agree this still is good value for the work undertaken at National, District, Branch and Borough levels.
